## Introduction to University Summer School

**Disability Support Services** at the University of Limerick are hosting a **two day** summer school to introduce prospective students to college life.

The summer school aims to support students with disabilities in making a successful transition to university. The programme will particularly benefit students with **autism, ADD/ADHD or dyspraxia**.

Participants will have the opportunity to explore the university campus, develop college skills such as organisation skills, self-management skills, IT skills, independent learning skills and self-advocacy skills. Participants will have the opportunity to find out more about university life and how to prepare for it. The summer school will be delivered in a relaxed environment with a small number of participants. Please be aware that places are limited.

### Who can register?

The summer school is open to second level students who have completed the junior cycle and who intend to pursue a university programme of study. The summer school is ideally suited to students in fifth or sixth year however transition year students are also welcome.

The summer school will take place on **July 25<sup>th</sup> and July 26<sup>th</sup> 2017** at the **University of Limerick**
