

## Transition to University Summer School 2018

The University of Limerick Disability Support Services is hosting a two-day summer school to introduce prospective students to college life.

The summer school is called **UXL** (You excel) and aims to support students with disabilities in making a successful transition to University. The programme is particularly suited to students with autism, ADD/ADHD or dyspraxia.

The aim is to allow participants find out more about University life and help them develop the skills they require for organisation, self-management, IT usage, independent learning and self-advocacy. The summer school will be delivered in a relaxed environment with a small number of participants.

### Who can register?

The summer school is open to second level students who have completed the junior cycle and who intend to pursue a University programme of study. The summer school is ideally suited to students in fifth or sixth year however transition year students are also welcome.

The summer school will take place on **Tuesday, July 24<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday, July 25<sup>th</sup> 2018** at the **University of Limerick**
