

Transition to University Summer School 2019

UXL (**You Excel**)

The University of Limerick Disability Support Services is hosting a two-day summer school to introduce prospective students to college life.

The summer school is called **UXL** (You excel) and aims to support students with disabilities in making a successful transition to University. The programme is particularly suited to students with autism, ADD/ADHD or dyspraxia.

The aim is to support students to prepare for University life and help them develop the skills they require for organisation, self-management, IT usage, independent learning, self-advocacy and social engagement. The summer school will be delivered in a relaxed environment with a small number of participants.

Please be aware that places are limited.

Who should register?

The summer school is open to second level students who have completed the junior cycle and who intend to pursue a University programme of study. The summer school is ideally suited to students in fifth or sixth year however transition year students are also welcome.

When is it on?

Due to demand two summer schools will run this year on campus at the **University of Limerick**

Group A will run from **Tuesday, July 16th to Wednesday, July 17th inclusive**

Group B will run from **Thursday, July 18th to Friday, July 19th inclusive**

The summer school runs from 10 am to 3:30 pm each day
